Cranbourne East Primary School

With the introduction of the department's Tutor Learning Initiative (TLI) in 2021, Cranbourne East Primary School identified an opportunity to provide targeted catch-up learning for students experiencing disruption to their learning due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Forming a Tutor Learning Initiative team of education support staff, graduate, and experienced teachers, they worked collaboratively to research, resource and implement the small group learning initiative at the school.

Since the TLI's inception, students from Year 1 to Year 6 have shown exceptional progress, with the majority of students achieving between 12 to 36 months of learning growth, especially those cohorts identified as at-risk with their learning, including English as an Additional Language, Koorie students and students in out-of-home care.

Fingers crossed our TLI team will receive the recognition for their outstanding work with our students. I will be attending the ceremony on the night and inform our school community (Compass post) once the announcement is made.

School Council Report

The President, Roz Coles opened the meeting of the School Council held on Wednesday 14th September with an Acknowledgement to Country. There was no conflict of interest to declare, or Child Safe Standards matters to discuss.

Payments were endorsed and transfers ratified, and all presented reports accepted as a true and correct depiction of Cranbourne East Primary School finances for the month of August 2022. School Council moved all statements and payments as tabled for the School Purchase Cards to be accepted for the month of June 2022. School Council set the Curriculum Contributions and Other Contributions for the 2023 School Year as detailed in the Parent Payment Arrangements.

David Muzyk (Assistant Principal) provided updates to the Child Safe Standards to the School Council. The updates to the Child Safe Standards are to be provided to the school community in coming newsletters.

A Zart Art Raffle Prize and Moonlit Sanctuary Family Pass provided to the school were tabled at the meeting. The Principal discussed the Attitudes to School Student Survey data with the School Council. The student survey data is to be shared with the school community in the next newsletter.

School Council approved the recommendation from the Canteen Sub Committee for BOCCA foods being the preferred school Canteen provider in 2023.

The following policies were ratified by School Council: Child Safety - Responding and Reporting Obligations Policy and Procedures, Child Safety and Wellbeing Policy, Bullying Prevention Policy, Complaints Policy and Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy.

The final items of General Business were for the School Council was to approve the Working With Children's Register and 2023 Year 6 Windcheater design.

Our last week of term 3 has been an exciting week with the following activities: Year 3 Camp (A and B) to The Briars during week, 2023 Foundation Year students visits to the school for school tours on Monday and Tuesday, District Athletics for selected students on Wednesday, Bike Education program community rides Wednesday and Friday, Year 2 sleepover at school on Wednesday and Thursday evenings, Whole school Footy dress up day (Go Tigers!!) on Friday and an Early dismissal for students at 2:30pm today.

I thank our students for their resilience and commitment to their learning shown consistently during this term. The work of staff across all levels and in all areas of the school is acknowledge and I pass on my gratitude for their work, going above and beyond and for the many 'behind the scenes' tasks our staff perform so that our students receive the very best in learning opportunities.

In Reading, to celebrate the student's engagement, we will be playing a range of different reading games that help students practise their decoding skills and automatic recall of High Frequency Words. In Writing, we will be writing recounts and in Maths we will be learning about duration of time and days of the week by creating our very own weekly timetable. Students have been working very hard all term on their MAPPEN Inquiry unit and we were very excited to welcome families into the school to view our 'Bridge and Beyond Showcase'. We are very much looking forward to Term 4 and all the fun things the students will be taking part in to finish off their Foundation year. A friendly reminder that students will need to wear their school hats next term as the weather heats up. Please ensure your child's hat is clearly named. Year 1



What a busy end to Term 3! Students attended Life Ed, learning more about Friendship. One of the highlights was meeting Harold the Giraffe. Students wore yellow for RU OK Day. We had our Indonesian Puppet Show Incursion where the students watched a shadow puppet play, did some Indonesian dancing, and made their own puppets in the workshop. And today was our Footy Dress Up Day - Go the Pies!

In Literacy, Year 1 students have continued practising their accuracy skills, identifying High Frequency Words, and recognising long vowel phonemes and graphemes (sounds and letter combinations). We extended our persuasive writing skills giving 3 reasons for our opinion on a

'Would You Rather' topic.

In Maths, we used hands-on materials to consolidate our understanding of subtraction strategies. Students used MAB, number lines, drew pictures and counted backwards to help solve verbal worded problems.

In our MAPPEN Unit, students performed their fairy tale play. They were encouraged to think about how Light and Sound could enhance their performance.

In preparation for Term 4, all students will need to have their school hat. Please ensure your child's hat is named. The holidays will be a great chance to help teach your child how to dry and dress themselves independently, ready for Swimming in November.



Year 2



In Reading, we have been working on inferences where students are using prior knowledge and text clues including written words and pictures to support their inferences. We have been using visual texts that students have really enjoyed, to make their inferences.

In Writing, the students focused on correct sentence structure ensuring they included the 'who, what, where, when'. Students were to include a subject noun at the beginning, a verb and adjective. The students worked collaboratively with peers to create sentences and find compound words to complete each sentence they created.

In Numeracy we have introduced division and students have been working very hard on sharing and dividing during our lessons. Students have been exploring with a range of materials including playdough, counters, and real-life problems. We have also introduced remainders for any leftovers.

We also had our Year 2 sleepover this week. The students were very excited to attend and participate in our special night.



Year 3

Students this week have enjoyed attending the Briars Camp in Mt Martha! This is the Year 3's first camp and they have done a fantastic job being away from home for 3 days and 2 nights. They have enjoyed creating stronger friendships with their peers during different team building activities and challenging themselves by going outside of their comfort zone. A few of the Year 3's highlights were the Giant Swing, Flying Fox and bush cooking. We look forward to sharing photos from both camps in our next Online Assembly.



Year 4



The Year 4 students have made it to the end of Term 3, and they need a well-deserved break!

During Reading, students have been forming opinions, making text connections, and writing summaries.

For Writing, they have been writing down their opinions and reasons about a topic. Students have been learning about how to 'hook' their audience with interesting sentence starters and working on their sentence fluency. They have been coming up with some creative writing pieces!



In our Maths lessons the students have finished learning strategies they can use to solve division problems. This week they have been having a lot of fun learning about mass and capacity. They have been making estimates and then using scales and measuring jugs/cups to find their object's weight/amount.

This week for MAPPEN, students had a ball finalising their cars, and raced them within the class and then with the rest of the year 4 classes.



Year 5

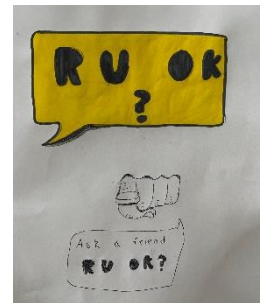
The final two weeks of Term 3 have been busy for the Year 5 students. They have been finishing off their Inquiry unit presentations using their coding skills which have shown their knowledge on the topic 'The Journey to Discovery'. This week, students will be putting their work on display and sharing their new learning with their classmates and teachers. In writing, we have been researching a variety of influential people and using our notes to write our own information reports on these individuals. Students have been challenging themselves in reading this week by reading more challenging books and practicing the different strategies to decode new words and workout their meaning. The final week in Maths have seen students focusing on mapping.



Students have created their own maps of the classroom as well as using coordinates on a cartesian plane. What a fantastic Term 3 the Year 5 students have had! The teachers are all incredibly proud of the growth they have demonstrated and are excited for everything to come in Term 4.

Year 6

During the last 2 weeks of Term 3, students presented their 'Journey to Discovery' MAPPEN scratch projects. We celebrated R U OK? Day by wearing a splash of yellow and checking in on each other. Students have enjoyed the free choice of Narrative writing and have explored different character traits, vivid vocabulary choices and editing skills. In Numeracy, students have finished their Place Value unit looking into concepts such as multiples, factors, square and triangular numbers, prime and composite and indices. We hope the students have a fantastic school holiday and are ready to jump into their final term of primary school.

In Performing Arts this week, Prep students discovered the cultural

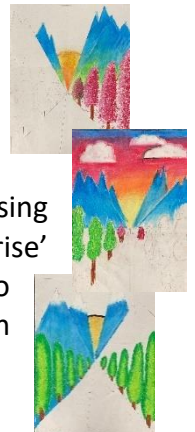

Over the last 2 weeks Foundation classes have been practising their scissor skills by cutting wide and narrow strips of coloured paper, fringing strips of paper then gluing them to create a colourful 'Mexican' style blanket. Year 1 and 2 students have thoroughly enjoyed using various techniques and materials to produce their 'Hot Air Balloons at Sunrise' collages. Students in Year 3 and 4 have carefully painted tree silhouettes onto their warm and cool coloured backgrounds and have experimented with various oil pastel blending techniques to colour their perspective drawings.

A lot of exciting things have been happening in science!

This week we wrapped up our unit of work on Biological Sciences. Foundation students have constructed living things using 'Kid K'nex'. Year 1 and 2 students have learnt about different habitats and the animals that live in them. 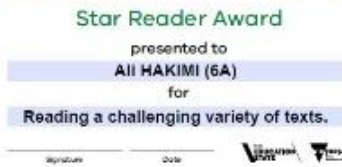

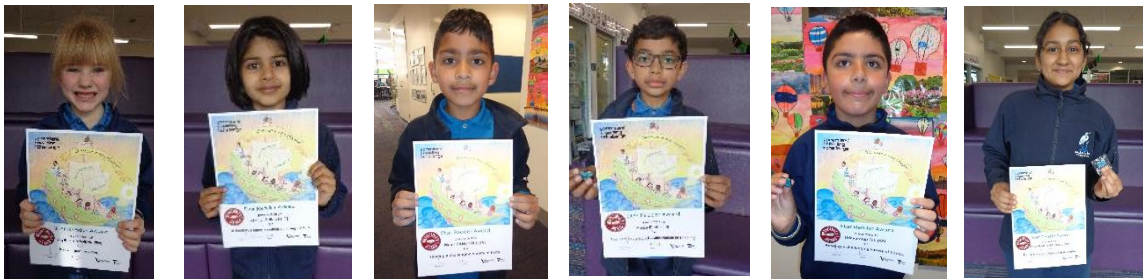


Premiers' Reading Challenge
