School Facility Maintenance and Works

During the school holidays the following works and maintenance occurred throughout the buildings and grounds: Detail clean of toilets, changerooms and showers, Internal and external windows and glass surfaces, all waste bins - inside and outside, desks, tables, locker trolleys and chairs, internal walls (up to 2m) and ceilings, and removal of any cobwebs, spot clean of curtains and blinds, soft furnishings and fabric chairs.

All carpeted areas were spot cleaned, ceiling fans, ducts, grills, vents and light fittings dusted. The Canteen was detail cleaned as well as kitchens (full clean of ovens, cooktops, cupboards and furniture). The Gymnasium floor was deep scrubbed. Grassed areas including the oval were cut. Playground soft fill areas maintained.

All garden beds were replanted, Fire Safety Inspections conducted and classroom maintenance checks (lights, ceiling tiles, minor painting, door closure checks/adjustments, blind check, door check, check for damaged desks/chairs, test sliding doors, check A/C units and Heaters) completed. Monthly Pest Control Inspections were completed through the entire school. These works ensure the school facility remains in the highest condition of cleanliness, is well maintained and remains safe for our students, staff and visitors.

Free Dress Fundraiser – Last Day Term 1

On the last day of Term 1 we invited students and staff to participate in a gold coin, Free Dress Fundraiser to support families affected by the recent floods. I am proud to announce we raised an incredible \$1 227.65 which has been sent directly to affected families.

Around the Grounds at CEPS

Foundation

Welcome back to our wonderful Foundation students! We are glad to hear everyone had a restful break and are ready for a great term of learning. We are impressed with how well students have settled back into school routines and are beginning the day ready to learn.

Over the next two weeks, we are having a big focus on revising the sounds we have taught in our learning spaces. Students are taking part in experiences that allow them to build words, create new words using rhyme and reading and writing words using sounds they know.

In Writing, students will take part in experiences that help them to explore the text type

Procedure. At the end of our unit, students should have an understanding of the purpose of procedures; teaching us how to do or make something. For Maths, we are continuing to build on counting skills. Particularly identifying numbers before and after and counting forwards and backwards from any number.

We also wanted to say a big thank you to those families who raised money for the Colour Explosion Fun Run! Our students had an incredible time and lots of fun was had by all!



Year 1

Year 1 students have returned from Easter holidays refreshed and eager to learn. Our highlight for the week has been the Colour Explosion Fun Run! In Reading, students have been looking at retelling the most important parts of a story using Somebody (character) wanted to (plot development) but (problem) so (solution) then (end of the story). This is something you might like to do at home as well.



In Writing, we have been learning about procedures. We learnt some different digraphs in spelling such as ch, sh, wh and ck. In Maths, we have been learning about fractions and recognizing half of a collection. Term 2 Inquiry Unit is about why changes happen. Last week we made playdough and we made a working volcano.

Year 2

The students have settled back into Term 2 very well, following our daily routines and engaging positively with peers. Last Friday students participated in our school colour fun run! The students were very excited and highly enjoyed this experience where they ended up full of colours!



In Reading, students have been focusing on summarising fiction stories, working on retelling the beginning, middle and end of a story including details. Over the next few weeks, we will be working on Readers Theatre where students practice their fluency and expression using their Oral Language.



In Maths, students have been learning about fractions $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$ and $\frac{1}{8}$. We have explored this through hands on materials such as playdough and Unifix blocks to demonstrate student learning and knowledge of fractions learnt. During Writing students have been



working on procedure writing where students had the opportunity to write a procedure and perform their procedure on how to cross the monkey bars safely. The students were highly engaged and enjoyed actively participating in their procedure.

Year 3

In Reading, the Year 3 students have been practising their comprehension skills using a variety of fiction and nonfiction texts, including online texts such as Epic. During Writing they have been creating narrative and persuasive pieces in a timed period. In our numeracy sessions the students have been focusing on fractions.



This term for Mappen we are looking at Sustainability.

On Friday the students eagerly participated in the Colour Explosion Fun Run. A fun day was had by all.

Year 4

It has been a busy start to the term in Year 4 but by far the highlight has been the Colour Explosion Fun Run!

During our Reading sessions, the Year 4 students have been looking for the main idea of various texts by highlighting key words and deciding the difference between key events and interesting details. Students have also begun to summarise short



texts by including relevant information. Our Writing sessions have seen students practising their skills in researching a mammal of their choice in order to complete an information report. The students have been learning to take

notes and convert the dot points into full sentences of their own words. During Maths, students have continued to develop and extend their understanding of fractions and decimals. We have begun exploring our MAPPEN unit 'Into the Unknown', which will expose the students to the concept of change over periods of time, with the aim to research various explorers around the world.

Year 5

During Term 2 the students in Year 5 will be continue practicing their skills and knowledge in preparation for NAPLAN in week 3 and 4. The students have done a fantastic job in completing various practice tests and should be proud of their efforts. Throughout the term, the Year 5 students will be exploring a range of exciting topics in Reading, Writing, Maths and Inquiry. Students will begin learning about Australian History and will conduct their own independent research about a particular event that interests them. Students will continue revising various writing structures as well as exploring fractions, decimals, time and shape in Maths. In Reading students will be learning about summarising and organising important information and ideas. We are looking forward to another Term full of learning, hard work and fun!

Year 6



It has been a positive, happy, and energetic beginning to Term 2. The Year 6 students have been working hard on their understanding of 'Chance' during our Numeracy sessions. Literacy lessons have seen our students



thoroughly enjoy researching their favourite Country, Animal or Sport. This has led to some high

levels of Information texts being written throughout the year level.

The school's Colour Explosion Fun Run was definitely the highlight of the week. It was amazing to see all our students so eager to get involved and enjoy the day. There were lots of laughter, smiles, and excited cheers!



PE



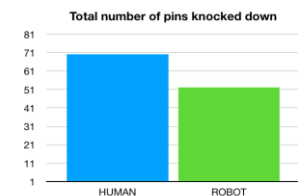
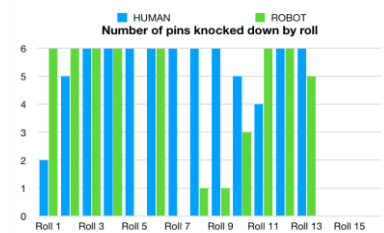
This week in PE students have been focusing on the rules and routines that ensure everyone is safe and has fun when participating in games and activities. This week students in Year Foundation to Year 2 practiced the skill of kicking. Students in Years 3 to Year 6 focused on our last athletic event, high jump. Well done everyone on a great start back to Term 2!

Digital Technologies Robotics and Data Collection in DigiTech



Our Year 3 students have been investigating the accuracy of Sphero robots in knocking down bowling pins. They asked, **'if we control the robot, will it get more pins down than if the same robot is programmed to do so itself?'** They

collected data on how many pins they knocked down when they controlled the robot and then compared this to when the robot was programmed to knock them down themselves. Their results were quite varied, but they were involved in great discussions regarding the factors that might make one more accurate than the other such as human error and bugs in programming. Here are some of their results.



Performing Arts



This week in performing arts, we had lots of fun playing drama and dance games and focusing on 'getting to know you'. Students were asked what they liked about performing arts and what they wanted to learn during their session each week! This is a drawing of one of the younger students showing me what their favourite thing to do in performing arts is. Looking forward to the term ahead!

Auslan

Students in Year 3 to Year 6 have been learning question signs such as 'who', 'what', 'when', 'where', 'why', 'how many', 'how old' and 'how much'. Once they had mastered the signs, students played Knock Out to practise their skills. They also learnt a new game called *I have, who has?* Students were able to focus on the sign 'who' while playing and importantly, having fun!



Visual Arts



To start the term our Foundation students have used collage to add cherry blossom branches to their porcelain vases. The Year 1 and Year 2 students are using collage and paint to create artwork called 'Hot Air Balloons at Sunrise'. The Year 3 and Year 4 students are exploring paper weaving and Year 5 and Year 6 students have experimented with various oil pastel techniques including blending, layering and stippling.

Science



A lot of exciting things have been happening in science! We have started our unit of work on 'Earth and Space'. Across the school we have been investigating the weather, sun, clouds and the solar system. We have been going for walks and looking up into the sky to help us learn about our environment. Students have also been lucky enough to explore and learn our new and improved sustainable garden! Our Gardening Club has commenced, and we have started planting seeds. We can't wait to share the progress of our garden with you!

Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and Cranbourne East Primary School is excited to be participating. The PRC application offers a range of exciting features including:

- access to a library catalogue (including book images and blurbs)
- a modern user-friendly interface
- rewarding students with badges as challenge milestones are achieved
- the option for a student to mark books as a favourite, give them a star rating or complete a book review.

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 2nd September 2022.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.

All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.

Introducing the School Wide Positive Behaviour Support Framework (SWPBS)

This year Cranbourne East Primary School has been excited to introduce The School Wide Positive Behaviour Support Framework (SWPBS) to support positive student behaviour with the same focused teaching approaches we use to teach academic excellence.

We believe happy, safe and engaged students learn best in a supportive and rich learning environment. The School Wide Positive Behaviour Support Framework (SWPBS) is a prevention-oriented framework that supports the needs and culture of the school by teaching and reinforcing positive behavioural interventions into an integrated continuum that enhances academic and social behaviour outcomes for all students. The SWPBS team has created a matrix detailing clearly defined sets of expected behaviours in the classroom, the school yard and while using technology at school.

Each day students focus on a weekly expectation relating to one of the CEPS school values: Respect, Responsibility or Resilience, which are all underpinned by the overarching values of Relationships and Rigour. Across all year levels, each class discusses why each weekly expectation is important to value and demonstrate within CEPS, how it looks in a classroom setting or in the yard and how we as a school can support each other to adopt positive behavioural approaches towards our learning and one another.

When SWPBS is implemented well, teachers and students have more time to focus on relationships and classroom instruction. Students and staff benefit from:

- increased respectful and positive behaviour
- increased time focused on instruction
- improved social-emotional wellbeing
- positive and respectful relationships among students and staff
- increased adoption of evidence-based instructional practices
- a predictable learning environment with improved perceptions of safety and increased attendance.
